 - Sheriff's Report - Dan spoke about upgrading to the front office of the courthouse. Dan also reviewed the Lake Patrol cost, he said that we made \$13,261 covering the lake, not factoring in vehicle fuel and maintenance. Dan stated that he did secure an additional \$1 per hour from the of engineers. With that increase Dan is looking to produce a more competitive wage to compete with local municipalities for part time officers for lake patrol. Dan spoke with the Wabash county sheriff about the code red alert service. Tim stated that Breese, and Carlyle use the service today, and that the county had it at one point. We will review further in an upcoming meeting. Dan stated that their 911 overtime has been higher than expected due to Covid going through the office.
